The DLAB is a quantitative estimate of the aptitude of a service member to learn a foreign language in a formal training program. Test components for DLAB are listed in DA PAM 611-16. The DLAB replaced the Army Language Aptitude Test (ALAT), and the Defense Language Aptitude test (DLAT) I and II, which are no longer acceptable qualifying criteria for entry into the Defense Foreign Language Program. The minimum qualifying DLAB score is determined by language difficulty category (LDC). Within their respective components, the Commanders of PERSCOM, NGB, and ARPERCEN will ensure that compliance with DLAB entry requirements be coordinated with and approved by the Army Program Manager (DAMI-PIT). Requests for waivers should include mitigating factors such as evidence of prior foreign language training or experience, especially in the language to be trained. Waivers to these requirements must be coordinated with and approved by the Army Service Program Manager (ODCSINT). Qualifying DLAB scores by language category are listed below.

 higher qualifying scores at their discretion.
- As mandated by HQ USMC, students who do not obtain the minimum score required for an MOS qualification or Officer Program must wait 6-months and 1-day before they are eligible for a DLAB retest.
