The EFAC is activated during times of emergency, either natural or man-made. The EFAC operates out of the Marine & Family Programs building on base and provides our military and families with emergency crisis services. Volunteers may be assigned to welcome and assess patrons on arrival, transport patrons to medical services on base, compile information and data, contact outside resources, assist in restocking supplies like food and water within the building.
